


INQUIRY PROJECT PRESENTATION



- What:** Individual presentations to a panel of your peers, parents, teachers, mentors, family members, etc. It is a time when you get to share new learning(s) about a topic of interest.
- Why:** Opportunity for students to pose questions, research, create an engaging presentation, and practice effective communication skills.
- When:** You decide.
- Who:** The role of the audience will be to listen carefully to presentations, ask the presenter appropriate questions, and to contribute kind, helpful, and specific feedback (when appropriate).
- Where:** You decide. Virtual? In-person?
- How:**
- 1) Use the Outline to think about, choose, and create a digital presentation using Google Slides, [Prezi](#), or another online tool of your choosing.
 - 2) Research & record the resources you use. Take notes which will be used to create your slideshow. Slides should be limited to 10 words max.

You could have **samples/visuals** and other realia to help to support the topic as well.

PRESENTATION OUTLINE

Please Note Where there are (slide). This means you should have a slide prompt.

OUTLINE for 8-10 minutes for presentation, 2 + minutes for questions

1. Introduction (slide)

State your name, and anything else you want us to know about you. Give a short overview of the presentation.

- Example: Good morning. Thanks for participating in my a Celebration of Learning. I am Juan Estrada. At home I enjoy playing soccer, reading biographies, and building model ships.
- (slide) Today, I will share **overview of your presentation**
- (slide) Why I chose this topic.....

2. Share experiences with/examples of the following. We have listed some ideas/prompts to help you get started in thinking about each topic.

• **Topic #1: Project/Deep Dive into Learning (slide)**

- Briefly describe the project or topic you dove into for this project. (slide)
- What did you learn or learn more about? (slide)
- How did your work deepen your understanding of the subject or question? (slide)
- What sticks with you from this experience? Why is this important in the real world? What will you remember? (slide)

• **Topic #2: You, as a learner (slide)**

- What have you discovered about yourself as a learner? When and how do you learn best? (slide)
- Did you improve your organizational skills or develop other habits that support your learning? (slide)
- **In what ways have you grown as self-directed learner? (slide)**

3. Conclusion

- Thank the panel and offer to answer any questions
 - Example: Thank you. What questions do you have? What are you wondering about... (slide)



INQUIRY PROJECT PRESENTATION

Some questions to prompt thinking during the preparation process:

- Why did you choose this example? What can you say about the experience?
- How did you feel when you were having this moment?
- What Habits of Heart and Mind helped you through this experience?
- What would you carry over from this experience and apply to a new experience?
- How has this experience shaped you as a learner?
- Why are these experiences important for your future?

Tips:

- Have images on your presentation to support your examples.
- Prepare/Practice to present in a natural way, instead of memorizing a script
- Dress to impress.
